

Situation Report: Emergency Humanitarian Relief Venezuela Earthquake Emergency Relief

Impact Report | Reporting Period: June 26–July 16th, 2026



HIGHLIGHTS



Over 11,000 individuals directly benefited through partner-led relief efforts in Caracas and La Guaira.



115+ tons of medical, food, and shelter supplies shipped from Colombia to Venezuela.



9 emergency medical missions carried out, supporting 5 hospitals and delivering care through **300+ medical encounters.**

Total Beneficiaries: Over 11,000 people



EMERGENCY SHELTER & FOOD SECURITY:

In partnership with the Congregation of the Sisters Servants of the Blessed Sacrament, established emergency shelter and a soup kitchen in Caracas, delivering over **6,000 hot meals in the first 15 days**. Daily meal service now reaches 200–250 people in La Guaira's Catia la Mar area, alongside distribution of tents, sleeping mats, hygiene kits, and essential medicine.

FOOD & HYGIENE PACKAGES:

10 one-week food packages, serving up to **1,100 meals**, and hygiene packages distributed to **10 families (55 individuals)** relocated to a community center in Barquisimeto.



PSYCHOSOCIAL SUPPORT:

320+ psychologists providing psychological first aid to earthquake-affected families, both in person and virtually.

MEDICAL MISSIONS:

9 emergency medical missions carried out, **deploying 70+ doctors** (from Colombia & from Venezuela) and rescuers to deliver direct medical care and supplies to **5 partner hospitals.**

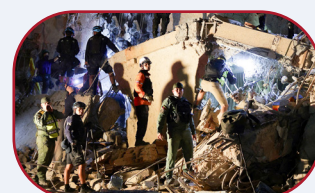


COMMUNITY & SHELTER SUPPORT:

20 communities and sectors directly supported, reaching 40+ NGOs (800+ individuals) and 10 shelters (2,000+ individuals), with **200+ volunteers engaged** in over **12,000 hours of assistance** across Bogotá, Caracas, La Guaira, and Medellín.

HUMANITARIAN CARGO & LOGISTICS:

115+ tons of medical, food, and shelter supplies shipped from Colombia to Venezuela by air and ground transport, supported by 22+ partner companies and 36+ social organizations.



INFRASTRUCTURE RECOVERY:

Technical inspections underway on homes, schools, and health centers, including rehabilitation planning for two damaged schools in Caracas to allow children to safely return to class.

SITUATION UPDATE – AID CHALLENGES

On June 24, 2026, Venezuela was struck by a rare seismic doublet, two earthquakes only 39 seconds apart, centered in Yaracuy state along the Boconó fault system. As of the July 13 official report, the earthquakes have caused 4,734 confirmed deaths, more than 17,000 injuries, over 70,000 people affected, and more than 47,000 people reported missing. More than 13 hospitals are operating under collapse conditions, and over 100 buildings were destroyed or structurally damaged in La Guaira state alone. Displaced families continue to face shifting shelter arrangements, restricted food distribution, and severely limited access to clean water, cooking fuel, and medical care – conditions especially acute in underserved coastal areas such as Catia la Mar. Alongside our partners, we are working to expand medical missions, sustain food and shelter support, strengthen psychosocial care, and begin the rehabilitation of damaged schools and homes as the response transitions from emergency relief toward recovery.
